If you would like to house two of the chicks at the end of term, please do come and see me. Please be assured that any unhoused chicks will return to the farm and will be well cared for.

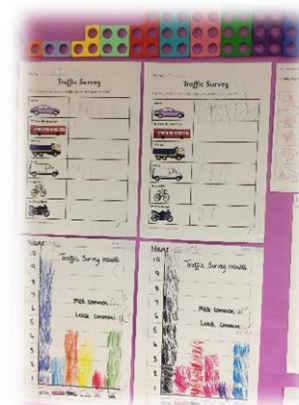


School Council
