We took part in another exciting experiment yesterday and predicted what would happen when a vitamin-c tablet was popped into a small film canister with water in it. #### Year 2

We've been weighing and measuring foods and investigating the sugar in foods. Then we had to try and design a healthy meal containing all the different food groups. We've also designed and made bug hotels and Aztec Totem Poles.

## Year 3

We have had a diverse and really exciting week. We challenged ourselves to make better nests than birds by collecting twigs and foliage from Westfield Park and then realised that making them was much harder than we thought! We also had an Astro Nappy Challenge and investigated materials that would be most absorbent for astronauts' nappies. We tested cotton wool, newspapers, tissue, kitchen roll and PVC. We really enjoyed Saro Wallace's visit and archaeology sessions on Monday and learned about fossilisation and sketched fossils.

#### Year 4

We really enjoyed the Tag Festival at Queen Anne's on Wednesday and were thrilled that we all made it to the semi-finals and one of our teams won the Plate! In Maths we've been shopping with our £1s and calculated how much change we should have, we've done quizzes on roman numerals and conversion of measures and have been revising the 24-hour clock. We've been looking at healthy eating again and planning meals for explorers with set calories and a budget and looking at the effects on the body of smoking.
