So how busy have we been this week?

The focus in **Reception** has been on the Grand Opening of the two role play areas: 'The Little Heights School' and 'Builders Yard'. These areas are motivating the children to write in role, they have also continued to practice 'sound talk' and blending letters. The children have been comparing heights and capacity and have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the signs of Autumn, and making autumnal creations (wait and see what they have made ... we'll show you in next week's assembly).

This week **Year 1** have continued to explore and identify the features of information texts. We have begun practising the long ladder family in handwriting and have created some awesome Autumn artwork. We have been learning our number bonds in Maths and measuring using cm and metres.

**Year 2** have continued to work on Maths problems linked to commutative law and writing the most wonderful poem. They have been drawing things that could go into the 'magic box' and have discussed and explored in Science why we need clothes made out of different materials so that they are 'fit for purpose'.
