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Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back. I hope you enjoyed a fabulous time with your families over the Easter holidays and are ready for the challenges and excitement this term will bring. We certainly are!

Our themes are: 'Animals' in Reception and Year 1 and 'Messing about on the River' in Year 2. Do read the class Topic Webs and Newsletters which have been compiled by Classteachers and emailed to you today as these will give you a good picture of what we have planned.



## Reception

In Reception we have started our new topic of 'Animals' and focussed on the story of the *3 Little Pigs*. We've written scene descriptions and re-told the story. We have designed and built houses out of different materials and tried to blow them down (with a hairdryer). We've done 'Pig Art' using clay, chalk and paint and filmed lots on the iPads.

We have decided on our new role play areas, written about what we did over the Easter holidays and have learnt how to halve and share equally in Maths. How busy have we been?

## Year 1

This week we have been learning the *Ning Nang Nong* poem by Spike Milligan. We have thought of actions to help us recite the poem. It has been lots of fun. In Maths we have been learning about grams and kilograms and have been using digital scales to weigh things. We have also started to learn a song...I am sure you may know by now what it is (we can't stop singing it!). We also ventured out into the park to look for Signs of Spring and have also written about what we did over the Easter holidays.

## Year 2

We have loved learning the story of *The Wind in the Willows*, especially acting out the roles which has helped us remember it. We've been working out how best to solve addition and subtraction problems with parts of the question missing and are 'cracking' our times tables. We are beginning to understand where we live locally and nationally and drew maps of our classroom. We have been doing weather investigations and measuring the rainfall and in Athletics we've been working on our speed and reaction times.

## MAYOR'S VISIT

We were delighted to welcome Mayor Sarah Hacker into school yesterday. She visited all the classes and spent time with Year 2 chatting to them. They asked her some really interesting questions. She was really lovely with them and we appreciated her taking time out of her busy schedule to come and see us.

The aim is that it will give you a greater understanding of what the children are learning, how it is being taught, the progress they are making and how you can help at home.
