Dear Parents and Carers

Before we talk about this week let me tell you about last weekend!

On Saturday morning lots of our Year 1, 2 and 3 pupils arrived at Chiltern Edge with their Mums and Dads to run in the first of the Oxfordshire Schools Winter Series Cross Country competitions. Berkshire don't have something similar to this so we were kindly invited to join other Oxfordshire schools. The Year 1s and 2s ran just under 700m across fields, through a woody copse and up a short steep hill whilst the Y3s ran 1000m. They all did brilliantly and there were some great individual results. ## Reception

The Reception children have been wonderfully curious learners throughout the week. We loved our autumn walk and spotted so many signs of the season changing. We found leaves of all colours and LOTS of conkers! We've been talking about and comparing different sizes, finding out what is small, what is big and who is the tallest. We can't wait to sing our Harvest song to our Grandparents and in assembly next week.



## Year 1



This week we visited St Anne's Church and there was a very special sense of awe and wonder as they explored the different areas and features of the building. The children have written super recounts of their visit and have written thank you cards. In maths we have explored money and have worked on identifying the coins we use. It would be great if you could continue to work on this with your children when in the shops. We have also been telling the time to the hour and are now focussing on half past.

## **Year 2**

We have independently written our non-chronological reports about dragons and can't believe we received a letter from another dragon from a different part of the world! We've used Google to identify the best places for dragons to live in the UK and will use our findings to write back to the dragon and give it our suggestions. We've been learning to add 1-digit to 2-digit numbers and now problem-solve all the time.

## **Year 3**

We have continued with our Egyptian topic this week and are looking forward to welcoming a qualified dance teacher into school on Monday to work with the class based around our Ancient Egyptians theme. We are also excited about the artefacts box which is arriving on Monday from Reading Museum. It will contain real Ancient Egyptian artefacts and will help the children gain an understanding of what the Ancient Egyptians were interested in and what it was like in an Egyptian tomb. We will be able to keep the box up until Christmas so the children will be able to get full use out of the objects inside.



## **Choir**

Mark from Berkshire Maestros came and led our assembly on Monday with Mrs Fallon and introduced plans for our first choir. It's fabulous to see how excited and enthusiastic the children are. We're sorry we have to limit numbers to 40 in the first instance but hope to develop separate KS1 and KS2 choirs in the future.
