Can you spot any noun phrases?
Is that a good sentence opener? Can you think of a better one?
Non-Fiction - Tell me a fact you've learnt from this page / book.



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Writing Christmas cards and letters to father Christmas, provide good writing opportunities. Whilst reading cards received and talking about the picture on the front of a card (and its meaning) help with reading comprehension.
