**Spelling:** Spelling lists will continue to be sent home on a **MONDAY** to be learnt for a test the following Monday. We will be completing spelling related activities in school each day to support the learning of these words.

Aaths: We will be continuing with the cracking times table programme. Each child will be working to their own level and will need to practise these tables at home. They will be tested on a FRIDAY and cracking times table books will be updated each week.

## ☆ ☆PE

Year Three PE will take place on a Wednesday afternoon (football) and Friday morning (swimming). It is very cold and muddy at the moment, therefore please ensure that your child has a suitable outdoor PE kit with them in school all week which includes a **separate PE jumper** and socks. It is also useful to have a separate carrier bag with PE kits for muddy trainers. Children are welcome to bring kit in on a Monday and it will be returned on a Friday. Please ensure that your child has the correct kit for swimming on Fridays including a swim hat and googles.
