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This term our theme is: Amazing Animals

This week we will be...

English	We will be learning to retell the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'.
0	Throughout the week the children will be sequencing the story, using
	puppets to tell the story and identifying some fantastic vocabulary in the
	story. On Friday we will be starting a new way of teaching extended
	writing called Big Writing with the children where they will write a story
	using a photograph as a stimulus.
Mathematics	We will be revisiting doubling and halving this week as well as spending
	some time practising place value up to 100. We need to be able to say
	how many hundreds, tens and ones each number has. E.g. 123 – One
	hundred, two tens and 3 ones. On Friday the children will be solving a
	problem as a group using clues.
Topic	In Science this week we will be going on a Spring walk to spot the
	changes we discussed last week. The children will be learning about
	Aboriginal Art and create their own animal aboriginal art. In Geography
	we will be finding out about which animals can be found on the different
	continents of the world. In Computing this week we will continue to use
	the Chromebooks to use a coding program.
