Communication and Language	Retell Rosie's Walk story using small world props Perform "Sign2sing" song using words and sign language
Personal Social and Emotional Development	Review our progress towards individual goals and targets
Physical Development	Multi-skills PE session. Dough Disco and Finger Gym,
Literacy	Write own "Rosie's Walk" story as a story map with captions. Handwriting b, p. Phonics /air/ear/
Mathematics	Problem solving can you work out whether the word problem is addition/subtraction? Now can you solve it and record as a number sentence?
Expressive Arts and Design	Make a mixed media Farmyard picture representing the story of Rosie's Walk using a variety of resources and textures.
Understanding the World	Learn how to program Blubot and challenge yourself to get Bluebot to a variety of destinations using a set of sequenced instructions

Please support your child by practising the sounds in their phonics book, their blending cards and helping them to explore and read their school reading book every day for 5-10 minutes using the guide in their Reading communication diary.

You can also help your child with their learning this week by..... make up number stories and ask you child to explain whether it is addition or subtraction. Can they record it as a number sentence? Can they make up their own number sentences

Parent and child challenge for the term!

Can you help your child to ... find a ways to melt an ice cube. Test how long it takes to melt in a dish indoors. Then find some ways to make it melt faster. Can your child think of a way to record the results? Please do send in/email some photos of your child's ideas and their results. Have fun!
