Communication and Language

- Listen to instruction and follow them accurately, asking for clarification if necessary.
- Carry out instructions which contain several parts in a sequence.
- Listen attentively with sustained concentration to follow a story without pictures or props.
- Listen in a larger group, for example, at assembly.
- After listening to stories, express views about events or characters in the story and answer questions about why things happened.
- Show some awareness of the listener by making changes to language and non-verbal features.
- Recount experiences and imagine possibilities, often connecting ideas.
- Use a range of vocabulary in imaginative ways to add information, express ideas or to explain or justify actions or events.

Physical Development

- PE: Athletics: learn how to perform different track and field events in preparation for Sports Day.
- Weekly multi-skills session.
- Handwriting: correct letter formation of all letters. Begin to use cursive writing, control letter size and place correctly on a line.
- Show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements.
- Move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space.
- Handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing.
- Hop confidently and skip in time to music.
- Hold paper in position and use preferred hand for writing, using a correct pencil grip.
- Begin to be able to write on lines and control letter size.
