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| English | This week we will be completing end of term assessments in spelling and grammar. We will also be independently writing a recount on The Earth Trust demonstrating what we've learnt this term. |
| Mathematics | In maths this week we will also be completing end of term problem solving and reasoning assessments, demonstrating what we have learnt throughout this term. |
| Topic | In topic, we will be learning about the Roman invasion of Britain and practise mark making in clay so that we are prepared to make our pots, inspired by the Beaker People next week. In science, we will be completing an assessment, demonstrating everything we have learnt about soil. |

Thank you for continuing to support your child with their reading, it has a huge positive impact on their learning. While reading accurately is important, it is also essential that the children understand the meanings of unfamiliar words as well as what has happened in the text. You can further support your child with this by asking them questions such as:

- What does this word/phrase/sentence tell you about the character/setting/mood?
- Why has the author chosen that word?
- What do you think ... means? Why?
- Can you explain why ...?
- Why did the author choose this setting? Will that influence the story?
- What is the main point in this paragraph?
- What do you think is happening here?
- Explain why...did that.
- What do you think the author meant by ...?
- Which words do you think are most important/like most? Why?
