This term our theme is **Superstructures**.

English	This week we will be starting to pull together ideas for our own newspaper reports. We will be thinking of catchy headlines and identifying the 5Ws that we need to include in our newspaper reports. We will then go on to write our newspaper reports, thinking carefully about what we need to include to be successful journalists.
Mathematics	In maths this week, we will be looking at division. We will be dividing numbers within our times tables and numbers just beyond our times tables. At the end of the week, we will be solving division word problems before completing a multiplication and division assessment to demonstrate everything we've learnt over the last two weeks.
Topic	We are looking forward to visiting the Caversham and Reading bridges this week to think about our local history and how these bridges have impacted our community. In science, we will be completing assessments to demonstrate what we know about light. This term in PSHE, we will be completing our 'Changing Me' topic. We will be learning how babies grow, how our bodies change inside and outside and what different families look like.

PE for Year 3 will continue to take place on **Tuesday** and **Wednesday** afternoons. It is essential that PE kits continue to come in on a Monday and go home on a Friday. If your child comes home in their PE kit, please can you ensure it comes back in the next day (it doesn't need to be washed, just bagged up).
