Happy St Patrick's Day!

It has been British Science Week and we have quite literally celebrated it with a bang, fizz, bloop, whizz and every other sound you can imagine resulting from a scientific investigation and experiment. All week the children have been developing their scientific enquiry skills and we have all had so much fun.

Thank you so much to Professor Fallon who set all this up. She is now officially our favourite Professor EVER!!

Reception

We have been doing so much linked to our topic of journeys this week. We learned how to make a tally chart when we did our traffic survey from the park and compared our results. We've been drawing, labelling and writing about vehicles to school and investigated forces using ramps and vehicles. We thoroughly enjoyed all our science investigations this week.

Year 1

We have loved making predictions about all the investigations we planned this week. Some of the flowers changed colour when we put them in dyed water and when we mixed Mento mints with coke - WOW! That was a messy and sticky one! In maths we've been learning subtraction facts to 10 and 20 and the odd and even number song.

Year 2

Our experiments during Science Week included investigating whether custard is a liquid or a solid and understanding how the liquid turns to solid when force is applied! We



investigated bubble mixture with Professor Fallon and learned about camouflage by pretending to be birds! In English we have been looking at descriptive settings, we even created artwork using only a descriptive setting as inspiration. In Maths we have been exploring shape. We've been describing 2D and 3D shapes and sorting them using Venn diagrams.







Year 3

We've completed lots of different investigations this week including the worm camouflage experiment where we found it difficult to locate and pick up the brown worms because they have adapted to their environment. We also learned how rocks change to become soil. We went out to the mud





mound to collect some soil samples and looked at them in detail with our magnifying glasses. We discovered stones, twigs, creepy-crawlies and water in the soil. Our 'Flower to Dye For' investigation is yet to show any results. We'll keep observing over the next week.
