Reception

In Reception this week our focus has been Autumn. We really enjoyed our Autumn walk talking about signs of Autumn and seasonal changes and loved seeing and spotting these. We had so much fun creating and making clay hedgehogs, autumn trees and pictures on Wednesday. We have learned so much in Phonics and Maths sessions already and have really impressed Mrs Rizvi and Miss Dawes with our progress.

Year 1

We have been continuing to build up our knowledge of The Great Fire of London and discussed differences between firefighters from 1666 and modern day. We couldn't believe it when we had a whole school Fire Drill straight after our discussion! We're really enjoying reading and writing poetry with an autumn theme using all our senses to help make it more interesting. In Computing we've been learning to use a new program 'Bubble Maths' and have worked hard to measure and weigh different objects.

Year 2

We welcomed the 'Punctuation Police' in Year 2 this week. They've been looking for 'criminal offences' with capital letters and full stops. We've been solving problems involving length and quantity in Maths and looking at different habitats from around the world and how animals have adapted to survive in these.

Year 3

This week we have really enjoyed exploring poetry. We've listened to all sorts of poems and become poetry detectives. We've learned about what Ancient Egyptians were and have designed our own Ancient Egyptian Jewellery and Headdresses.



Year 4

We have started to read The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe. This has inspired us to create our own imaginary and unusual place and write a description of it. In Maths we've been using our knowledge of place value, number bonds and cumulative law to estimate and solve these problems and some of us have started to explore decimal numbers. We've been developing our knowledge of life in Guatemala and

composed an amazing rainforest inspired piece of music as a whole class! Mrs Edwards loved it!
