Reception

We have had such a giggle looking at baby photos of ourselves, our classmates, teachers and even Mrs Edwards. We've used them to help us think about how we've grown and changed and have written some 'then' and 'now' captions. We've been learning about capacity in Maths and can solve some problems using vocabulary such as full, empty, half-full, half-empty.

Year 1

Inspired by our performance of 'School Kids' Rap' last week we have learned to recite 'Twas the Night Before Christmas' using different actions. In Science we've been making some riddles about different objects' properties and in History we've been acting out the events that led to the 'Great Fire of London'.

Year 2

This week we've been exploring stories from around the world, including 'The Dragon Painter'. This is a traditional Chinese story re-told by Rosie Dickins. We're starting a unit of multiplication in Maths and have been using arrays to help us. This is where counters are set out in rows and columns. We're exploring materials that squash, bend and stretch in Science and would like to look at some objects at home this weekend and discuss their properties and the materials they're made of. We've been busy learning songs for our KS1 Production and can't wait to perform to you at St Andrew's Church.
