## Reception

In Reception last week we concentrated on jobs people do. We talked about different jobs our parents and relatives do and wrote descriptions of jobs we'd like to do when we grow up and about occupations of different family members. In Maths we've been exploring capacity and using vocabulary such as full, empty and overflowing. We're really enjoying learning our songs for our Nativity production and wait to perform to everyone in the last week of term.

#### Year 1

As well as completing assessments, we've continued to build our Tudor Houses and sew our Christmas Stockings. We've been developing our core and flexibility with Yoga and Pilates and created our own Christmas decorations to decorate our classrooms.
