# Skern Lodge Meeting

We have a meeting about the Year 6 Residential at Skern Lodge (October '19) at 3.30pm next Thursday 21st March. The meeting will be held in Mr Gillick's office.

### Reception

We've been handling data this week and learnt how to use a tally sheet when we carried out a traffic survey from Westfield Park. We've also been investigating forces using different ramps and vehicles.

#### Year 1

This week we've been learning to write poetry and how to use rhyming words and then performed our poems to each other. We've been learning more about 2D shapes and their properties in Maths as well as different fractions and quantities of things. In Science we've been busy planting herb seeds and are recording our findings in Herb diaries as we investigate growth.

#### Year 2

Maths has been tricky, but fun this week. We've been learning how to subtract one and two digit numbers from two digit numbers and then used our knowledge to solve subtraction problems. In Science we've been learning about different food groups and how to create our own healthy food plate. Do ask us about the similarities and differences between Mexico and England as we've been discussing these in our Geography lesson.

### Year 3

Our trip to the Earth Trust this week really helped bring our topic to life. It has been so interesting looking at the Bronze and Iron Ages and seeing how they differ to the Stone Age. We enjoyed wind, sun, rain and hail but still had a great time. Many thanks to all the Year 3 staff for organising it and leading the trip and to Jill Watts for helping on the day.



## Year 4

We have been working hard on our discussion texts about whether animals should be used in circuses. After debating the issue, we all took a vote and will, over the coming week, spend time writing to the Government to persuade them that our point of view is correct and ask them to respond accordingly. Following our trip last week, we've been completing our guide books on Fishbourne Palace. We've also really enjoyed looking at the box of artefacts we borrowed and completing different activities in it.



### Year 5

We are really enjoying our focus on Science Fiction writing and have started to write Dr Who play scrips. We've been considering the movement of planets in our Earth and Space topic and are really looking forward to visiting the Science Museum at the beginning of April. As part of our Healthy Me topic, we're starting to learn about Emergency Aid and are pleased we'll get the chance to have a First Aid training session in the summer term.
