Parent Class Rep Meeting

Thank you to all the Parent Class Reps who met with me on Monday and raised some really interesting points. The minutes of the meeting will be issued shortly.

Reception

This week in Reception, our theme has been 'My Home'. We have been learning words to label a house and creating 3D models of houses using a selection of resources. We've been learning about the numerals 16-20 and are so excited to have started learning some of the songs for our first Nativity in school.

Year 1

We have bene working hard this week to identify nouns, adjectives and verbs in different texts and use them effectively in our writing. We've really enjoyed learning about direction and position in Maths and using our knowledge to direct the Beebots to different targets. We've been identifying different clouds as part of our weather unit in Science and in DT we have loved using the saws to cut the wood we will need to make our Tudor houses.

Year 2

This week we have been making story maps for our castle report and learning actions so we become familiar with the text. We have looked at what material is the best material to make a castle roof by looking closely at different materials and their properties. We have also looked at the features of a castle and noted how castles were not only homes for a Lord and Lady, but were fortified for everyone inside.

Year 3

This week, we have been writing our non-fiction reports about Mummification to send to some Egyptologists. Mrs Edwards came into one of our lessons and said she was blown away by how well we were focussing on our work and organising it into paragraphs, then checking and improving it. We were really interested to learn about Tutankhamun's life and how Howard Carter discovered his tomb and in Science we explored and build on our knowledge of skeletons.

Year 4

This week, we started work on Roald Dahl's book 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. We are hoping to learn from Dahl's writing techniques and hone our inference skills. We'll also be writing and performing poetry and making medicine bottle labels. In Maths, we've continued to practise using common multiplication to solve a variety of problems and in Geography we found out about the ring of fire in the Pacific Ocean. We enjoyed making our Internet Safety presentations and are building up our confidence using practical language in our French lessons.

Year 5

We have really enjoyed looking at the features of a suspense and thriller text as we finished our story about King Arthur. We talked about the use of features such as clues to tantalise the reader, short shocking sentences and interesting synonyms. We reminded ourselves of the features of an engaging biography before writing one about King Arthur. In Maths we've continued our work on subtraction and in Science we've considered the key question 'How can we separate mixed materials using filtration, evaporation and sieving?'. We used salt and rice, salt and water and flour and raisins to help with this.

Year 6

In English this week, we've had a lot of fun writing non-chronological reports which describe the habitats, diets and behaviours of our own imaginary perfect pets. After learning about percentages, we have now moved on to Ratio and Proportion and will be using these to solve real life, practical problems. In our tipic, we have been looking at the technological innovativeness of the tank in World War One, explaining the impact it had on the war and the usefulness of its various design features. Despite having to walk (or jog) to the tennis courts at Christchurch Meadows for our Hockey lesson on Wednesday, we really enjoyed it as we have so much more space to practice and use our skills.
