## Reception

In Reception this week, we've amazed ourselves with learning the phonemes 's', 'a', 't' and 'p'. We also have been focussing on the story of 'The Little Red Hen' and were SO excited to meet some real hens. Thank you to Mrs Lowe for bringing them into school. We've been counting all sorts of things, out loud and using rhymes and have been matching and sorting numbers. We really enjoyed going on an Autumn walk and collecting leaves for some art work.



#### Year 1

Year 1 have been focussing on their sentence writing and letter formation this week and have enjoyed developing it by including describing words to talk about the Great Fire and How the Fox Stole Fire. The children have also drawn views from Samuel Pepy's windoe, thinking about what they may seen, heard, smelled and felt.

### Year 2

The children have been inspired by their Castles and Dragons topic and the book they've been sharing 'Tell Me a Dragon' by Jackie Morris. They have been thinking about what their own dragon might be like and have even started to sketch them. They've been investigating living things and their habitats in Science and developing their place value knowledge in Maths.

## Year 3

This term's theme of Fantastic Pharaohs has already gripped the children and they are thoroughly enjoying their class book 'There's a Pharaoh in Our Bath'. In topic, the children have been learning about why the River Nile is so important focussing on the Seasons, flooding, growing and harvesting. The children really enjoyed Cressida Cowell's talk on Monday.



## Year 4

We've been learning about the layers of a tropical rainforest using the Chromebooks and loved completing our salt dough models of South America. We've worked hard on our recounts of our trip to Longridge and are really pleased with our use of fronted adverbials.

#### Year 5

This week, we've continued to read the first story in the Beowulf book and have been working collaboratively to produce a live news TV report on the Grendel murders. In Science, we've been assisting the organisers of camp Bestival by investigating which paper will make a good bag for greasy food. We're enjoying learning about the history of rock and pop in Music and studying Bon Jovi's 'Living on a Prayer'.

#### Year 6

We have really enjoyed writing our own Autobiographies this week, chronicling our action packed lives. We're loving reading Private Peaceful as a class and exploring the events that led up to Britain joining the First World War, analysing primary sources such as newspaper articles and letters. In Computing, we're looking forward to completing a digital scavenger hunt and we used different techniques to draw some self-portraits.
