Reception

As well as continuing with our Phase 2 Phonics: CK. We've checked out some tricky words and are blending so many more sounds together. We've been reading 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley', by S Roberts and discussing how he feels throughout the book. In Maths, we've been comparing amounts of objects and writing numbers in number sentences. We discussed Remembrance Day and hand printed Poppies and are loving the Carousel of Activities which we're doing each Wednesday, including Spanish, Cosmic Yoga, Forest School and Dance. We're getting ready to practice for our Christmas Production and can't wait!

Year 1

This week, we've been continuing to improve and develop our sentence skills through the exploration of poetry. We've been enjoying reading and performing poetry as well as writing our own piece, 'A Tiny Burning Flame'. In Maths, we're learning about fractions, how we can share cakes and biscuits and find halves and quarters of amounts. In Science, we've become meteorologists and weather investigators and have started recording weather information using a weather diary. We've enjoyed investigating what clouds tell us about the weather and how clouds form. We walked to St Andrew's Church on Tuesday afternoon. It was lovely to visit and learn all about it with Reverend Nigel Jones. Thank you for organising this, Mrs Harrison. We had so



much fun designing and making our own stained glass windows at school and then comparing them with the ones we saw at the Church.

Year 2

We've been really busy planning and writing paragraphs for our leaflets about Castles and have started to add photos and diagrams to them. We've been adding one digit numbers to 2 digit numbers and using our number bonds and a tens frame to help us and also

used a strategy for addition called 'Bridging'. We've been learning to play Hockey and do Yoga in our PE lessons and made our own Poppies as well as looking at the book 'The Christmas Day Truce'. Today we were visited by a Chief Yeoman Warder of the Tower of London. He was SO interesting!

Year 3

We've been busy this week. We've been developing our reading comprehension skills by exploring different texts and answering different questions to demonstrate our understanding. In Maths, we've been using Times Tables Rockstars to help us learn our times tables and exploring how to find half, quarter and three-quarters of a number. We've loved learning about the process of mummification and really can't wait to write our non-chronological reports on this as well as dress up and experience a little bit about what it was like to live in Ancient Egyptian times on our Egyptian Day.



Year 4

In Maths, we've been wrapping up our unit on addition and subtraction and Mr and Mrs Alcivar and Mrs Dimmick have said how well we've been using the column method to solve and check our answers. This week, we've really focused on subtraction, practicing subtracting two 4 digit numbers with more than one exchange. Mrs Edwards came into our classrooms this week and was really impressed with our topographical creations of the Continent of South America – what do you think? We've really enjoyed our hands-on lesson about digestion, although some of the re-enactments about what happens in the digestive system were pretty yucky!



Year 5

This week, we watched an animation of the Norse Creation Myth. We broke the story down into parts and acted it out before re-writing the myth in our own words. We've been revising our knowledge of what happens when we multiply by 10 and 100 using this to start multiplying by 1000. In Science, we've been making predictions about how we can separate mixed materials using evaporation, sieving or filtration before testing it. We've been revising Primary and Secondary Sources in Topic and learning more about different festivals in RE All of us in Maple Class are looking forward to sharing a French Experience with our parents in the Activity Studio next Tuesday afternoon where we can showcase some of the French we've learned and knowledge about different famous landmarks in Paris.

Year 6

As Mrs Edwards mentioned above, we've been looking into and writing informal letters from the perspective of soldiers and loved ones fighting in the First World War. We tried to use deep, empathetic language to portray emotions that would have been paramount to these letters to and from home. We also discussed and debated the idea of the armistice and the effect it had on soldiers fighting in the final stages of the War. We hope you have been able to see and enjoy some of the poppies we've displayed around the school site in commemoration of the brave soldiers who have given their lives for future generations. In Maths, we've been learning how to use percentages interchangeable with fractions and decimals and calculate percentages of a given quantity.




Parent Consultations
