We have had another hot, but busy and fun filled week. We hosted our second Year 5 Enterprise Day yesterday, welcoming Year 5 pupils from Caversham Primary and St Anne's to join our Year 5s in taking part in a range of entrepreneurial activities throughout the day. Despite the heat, all the children really enjoyed the experience. Many thanks to Mrs Thomas for organising the day and to Mr Griffiths, all the year 5 team, staff from Caversham Primary, St Anne's and our guest speakers, Clare from Nood Stores, William Ind and Dr Schofield for helping make the day such a success.



We also had our first, Inter-School staff Netball match against Emmer Green on Tuesday. We had so much fun and the result was a 13 all draw. We can't wait to have more fixtures with Emmer Green and other schools in the future.



Reception

This week, we have continued to learn the story, 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt', as well as the actions that we will be using when we perform it to you in a few weeks. We have also started to learn our Level 4 phonics and been using the sounds we have learnt so far to blend to read words and segment to write words. In Maths we've been recapping our knowledge of doubling numbers up to 12 and have been naming 3D shapes and talking about everyday objects that are the same shape.

Year 1 We had our phonics screening check this week and Mrs Houghton and Loveday said they were sooo impressed and pleased with our efforts and achievements. We're pretty pleased too! In DT, we have been designing the packaging for our cookies and in Art, we have been sketching still life in our sensory garden. In Maths we have been using Numicon and paint to practice our number bonds, repeated patterns and addition to 20.









Year 2

This week, we have had a shared guided reading week, focusing on the books 'The Storm Whale' and 'The Secret of Black Rock'. We have been developing our abilities to discuss texts in detail, summarise them and make predictions. We have also been learning how to contrast and coand mpare texts, giving reasons and identifying In Science we revisited our understanding of parts of a plant and then set up an experiment where we investigated what plants need to grow best.

Year 3

This week, we have been learning about different types of poetry. At the beginning of the week we read and reviewed a selection of poems. We then created our own poetry, including a Haiku poem and chose our favourite piece to publish. In Maths we've begun our learning on measurement and have been measuring length using the appropriate equipment and units. In Science, we have been labelling the different parts of a plant (flower, stem, roots and leaves) and learning about their function. We loved our Superstructure Lego Workshop today! We had so much fun and look at what we built collaboratively!









Year 4

This week in our topic work we have continued to learn about the history of Caversham. We have been looking at photographs and maps of Caversham going back as far as 1790 to help us understand how our local area has changed over time.

In English we have continued our work on poetry and have been learning about how rhyme and meter can be used in poems. We explored different ways that rhyming poems could be structured and enjoyed writing our own poems. In Maths we have continued with our unit about time and have been reading both analogue and digital times.

Year 5

We are really enjoying writing letters, as Greeks or Spartans, trying to persuade our friends or family members to live in our city states of Athens or Sparta and look forward to publishing and sharing them with you. In Maths we finished our unit on decimals and have started a new block of work on negative numbers. In Science we have been focusing on asexual reproduction in plants and in PE, we've been developing our techniques for throwing the nerf rockets and high jump. Ready for Sports Day. We had a really busy end to the week with Enterprise Day and then the Cricket Festival. Both were great fun! Thank you so much to Mrs Thomas, Mr Griffiths, all the Yr 5 team and PS for organising and running both events.









Year 6

This week we started rehearsing for our musical production of Oliver. We have been working closely with each other and the adults in Yr 6 to ensure that the production has all it needs to run smoothly. We are already super excited about performing it to everyone next month. As well as all the work we're putting in to the production, we have continued to explore Madhubani art from north-east India and have been making use of vibrant colours and striking contrast to recreate some of the striking pieces we've seen. In IT we have been learning how to make use of more complex formula to create a useful, but also fun, tool: a randomiser! It's been great fun learning how to generate random numbers and apply them to a table of items using lookup tools. We

have also enjoyed taking part in the 'A Week in China' project where we have learnt about Chinese culture, language, character formation and much, much more!
