### Reception

We had so much fun on our Sports Day on Monday and are so pleased that so many of you were able to come and enjoy it with us! Thank you. We also watched the Year 6 Dress Rehearsal of their production of Oliver and it was amazing!!!

This week, we've also been learning all about three letter adjacent consonants, such as 'sch' and 'tch' - it sounds like we're talking a foreign language - but it's actually pretty straight forward.

In Maths we've continued to count on and back, using the calendar and discussing numbers above 20 and we really enjoyed our 'move up' afternoons. We are really excited about moving up to Year 1.

### Year 1

We also thoroughly enjoyed our Sports Day on Monday and can't wait to see who wins overall, following the KS2 Sports Day next Friday. We used this exciting day and experience, to help us write recounts of it and are hoping that we can demonstrate our writing skills in our final reports.

In Maths we have continued with our topic of time and have been looking at before and after and hours, minutes and seconds. We also loved meeting and spending time with the teachers who will be teaching us next year and we created self-portraits using collage during our move-up afternoon.













### Year 2

We spent a bit more time on our letters to Matt Rodda, as we feel so passionate about them and are now looking forward to sending these off and hopefully, receiving a response from him. We're also looking forward to creating our own invention to help protect the ocean. Watch this space!

In Science, we completed an experiment inspired by Rachel Carson - the scientist who discovered the damage caused to the ocean habitats and food chains, by pesticides used in farming. We are super excited about our trip to the Lookout Discovery centre in Bracknell next Tuesday. In Year 2 art we have been recreating The Great Wave of Kanagawa by Katsushika Hokusai. We have put lots of effort into our art and are very proud of the results



### Year 3

In Maths we completed an arithmetic and reasoning paper to assess the progress we've made in this unit and also used learnt strategies to add and subtract mass and read a variety of scales. In topic, we created the flat nets and added details and windows, ahead of creating our 3D superstructure city next week.

In our English lessons this week, we have continued our unit about adventure stories and have been planning our own adventure stories, including who the hero and villain of our stories will be.

In Maths , we have finished our unit about statistics and have started our next unit, which is properties of shape. In our topic work, we have continued our Art unit inspired by Gaudi and have been looking at different ways to create texture in artwork.

In English, we have enjoyed writing our balanced arguments, discussing whether Athens or Sparta was the better city state. It has been fun sharing our homework projects with our classmates and staff. Wow! What a week! We have been sooo busy preparing for our performance of Oliver next week. We had a Dress Rehearsal on Monday afternoon and performed in front of all of KS1.
