

AWARD ENTRY WINE FOR £5 PER BOTTLE!

If you enjoy amazing quality wine at an equally amazing price (with a small commission going to the PTFA), then I'm sure you'll be very interested in the following... Decanter magazine run the world's largest wine tasting awards - The Decanter World Wine Awards (http://www.decanter.com/decanter-awards/). Each entrant (over 18,000 this year) is required to send a 12 bottle case in for the judging process, from which bottles are used as the wines pass through the various potential stages of judging. At the end of this process, there is a vast quantity of wine remaining and Decanter magazine are selling this raising money for the charity, WaterAid.

We have the opportunity to offer this wine to parents for £60 per case of 12 bottles, the equivalent of £5 per bottle!!

There are of course some T&C's:

- We can only accept orders for complete, 12 bottle, cases

- The nature of the sale sees each case of 12 bottles purchased being a lucky dip from the wines sent in for awards (it is not possible to request a specific style of type of wine) and are non-refundable.

- The bottles purchased through this sale will have multiple stickers and barcodes and some wine labels may be unfinished as some bottles are preproduction for the awards

- If you receive a corked, oxidised or otherwise faulty bottle of wine in one of your lucky dip cases, this will not be refunded or replaced by Decanter with a new bottle due to it being a charity sale.

There is no restriction on the number of cases you may purchase from this offer.

To make it worthwhile we will need to order in bulk and will therefore need to collect payment from everyone in advance. This would need to be

received by the 23rd July and we would then inform you when your case(s) have been delivered and are ready for collection.
