Charanga: Exploring improvisation. How does music teach us about looking after our planet?



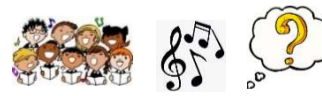
Charanga: Music that makes you dance. How does music make us happy?
