Reception

Reception have been 'secret agents' this week. They were number spies and had to write and relay numbers correctly so that the information could be passed on to the London 'code breakers'. It was great fun. They also completed some brilliant writing about their favourite book characters on World Book Day and you will be able to see this in their folders during next week's Parent Consultations.

Year 1

The Year 1 children had a surprise on Monday: they had to guess who Toby Tiger went home with at the weekend. Joe listened to all the clues and worked out that Toby was with me! We had an amazing time together - look at him posing in his new trainers.

Year 1 celebrated St David's Day - Olivia told us about her Welsh relatives, and we found Wales on our map of the UK. We thought about the differences between the fierce Welsh dragon and the peaceful Chinese dragon.



We continued our Space theme by thinking about a game of 'Moon Football' (e.g. What would the rules be? How would you play?). We wrote a set of instructions for playing Moon Football, and then tested how well written they were by using a few examples to play games outside! Also, we have been improving our instructions to make a small rocket and each making and decorating our own following these instructions. In Maths we have been measuring everything we can get our hands on, using string for curved shapes and unifix cubes for straight lines. We made characters who 'magically' increased in size, measured the 'before' and 'after' lengths or heights, and noted the 'difference between'. Some of us even translated this into an addition or subtraction sum.

World Book Day was a lot of fun, we all wrote about why we had chosen to dress as our character and what we liked/disliked about them. We shared lots of books with each other and Roshni introduced us to the Snortle it's well worth a read and is available from Caversham Library.

Friday was Holi, the Hindu festival of colour, and we had lots of fun blowing many colours of paint across paper to see what we could create!
