Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your support of Comic Relief today. It was great to see the children wearing different red clothing and develop their understanding of who is supported by the money that is raised and how. We have raised £100 so far.

So what have we been doing all week?

Reception

The children's writing has been centred on the book 'Whatever next' where a baby bear travels to the moon.



They have been coming up with their own versions of events and some have written about him travelling to the Antarctic, the Pyramids or Mars on all modes of transport. In Maths they have been continuing to develop their understanding and skills of counting on from a number in 1s, 2s, 3s and 5s. We have started to play tag rugby (more the 'tag' than the rugby yet) in PE and the children loved pulling their own tags off as fast as they could when I said 'draw!'. They are indeed the fastest 'taggers' in the west (Caversham). As we move into Spring the children have had the opportunity to be creative and paint pictures of daffodils. They have also been developing their IT skills by selecting an

image of an occupation from a program in Purple Mash and using the web cam to take a photo of their face which is then superimposed into the image making it look like they are Doctors, Astronauts or Farmers.

Year 1

Year 1 had a rather exciting start to the week, with three different teachers teaching them on Monday as

part of the Year 2 teacher interviews (plus Mrs A Edwards, of course)! Having different teachers is always a challenge, but we were so proud of their behaviour; they showed all the Heights values, especially respect, and were a credit to us all.

We have been looking at fantasy stories in Literacy this week. One task was to write Alien poems in pairs; I was really impressed at the ability of each child to discuss and to try to take on board each other's ideas, then build on them together. Very proud teacher!

We have been building on our knowledge of Capacity in maths and we have begun turning this knowledge into bar-graphs and tally-charts. Year 1 have also been linking our two Journey topics this term (Over



Sea/Into Space) by comparing the explorers Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. We discussed - at length! - which explorer we felt was the most brave, and why. Some really interesting and well thought-out answers - do ask your children! "Christopher Columbus got it wrong because he thought he was in India but it was America and anyway he only went for 5 weeks" vs "Neil Armstrong only went to space after lots of people had tested it already so that was not really that brave." Informed and intelligent reasoning and questioning, using textbooks to find answers - love it!
