# What have we been up to?

All the classes have been learning about 'Space'. CBeebies have a stargazers programme the children might find really interesting and we are all looking forward to the mobile planetarium experience on Tuesday morning.



#### Reception

Reception classes have been developing their writing trying to use words that make their sentences more interesting and have been really concentrating on their formation of letters and numbers. In Maths their counting on and back is rapidly progressing and they will be focusing on ordering next week. They have been developing their knowledge and understanding about healthy living with a focus on 'Germs' and have been finding out about Spring. Did you know that today is officially the First Day of Spring?



# Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy week, as usual beginning with an investigation to see if we could find answers to given questions about our solar system. This involved searching non-fiction texts, using contents pages, indexes and glossaries, and also safely searching for information online using the class computers. You can access the lovely song about the solar system that we have been listening to by going to Youtube and typing in 'the solar system song' and finding the one by KidsTV123.

We have been investigating the way that the Earth moves around the sun, and how that relates to the hours of daylight we have in each

month. We discovered that the summer months have the most daylight, and the winter months have the least. We will be continuing our seasons work over the next couple of weeks by looking at Spring. In Literacy we have been writing our own fantasy stories involving an alien. A good story means 50 much to remember; not just capital letters, finger spaces and full stops, but connectives, adjectives and verbs too... plus remembering to include a beginning, a middle and an end!

In Maths we have been working on relating addition and subtraction facts. So if we know that 5+3=8, we also know that 3+5=8. We have been working on understanding that this also means that 8-5=3 and 8-3=5. A tricky concept, but everyone has been working hard, using objects to help us visualise the number sentences. We have also been working with 2-digit numbers using a 100 square to add/subtract 10, then small multiples of 10 ("spider counting").

# PARENT CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

I had a really constructive meeting with Parent Class Representatives yesterday. Notes of this will be passed on to you all.
