Dear Parents and Carers

I don't know who has been busier this week - the children or yourselves! Thank you so much for your interest and support of the KS1 Maths and Ladders at Home sessions for parents as well as the preview of proposals for the permanent site. We hope you found them informative and helpful. The Maths presentation will be emailed to all Year 1 and 2 parents and also popped on the website.

Reception

The children have been using positional language whilst observing and being





with the chicks. They have created observational paintings of spring, written acrostic poems and learnt and talked about the importance of hygiene and road

safety. They have continued to develop their maths skills, writing and recognising numbers to 20 and using tally charts to keep count of the laps they ran on the field during Sport Relief. Whew!

Year 1

This week in Maths we have been working on doubling and halving, counting in multiples and missing number patterns and problems. In English we have been acting out the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have filmed ourselves acting out the story and will look at it again next week and improve it. We have also been assessing the children in English, Maths and Phonics and are delighted with their progress.

Year 2

In Year 2 this week, we have been exploring how fragile our world is. We have used the stories *One World* by Michael Foreman and *The Tin Forest* by Helen Ward to think about the impact that people have on our planet. We have been writing exclamatory sentences. What a great job Year 2 have been doing! We have also been learning *The Tin Forest* story and will use it in our writing.

In Maths, we have been exploring different methods to add and subtract. We have revisited partitioning and vertical methods. We have all grown in confidence when regrouping numbers.

In Design Technology, we thought about the ways we can reuse or recycle materials. We designed and then made our very own

recycled instrument orchestra. We all enjoyed playing in groups and making up chants and songs.

In Science, we have examined food chains. We have also researched endangered animals and then we used our research in both Maths and Literacy sessions.

SPORT RELIEF

Now I know you won't be surprised to learn that I was in my element with our sporty focus today. The children were amazing, challenging themselves to run and walk further than they thought they could over a 15 minute period. Their achievements, as well as the staff's, were impressive. Our final Celebration Assembly of the term will be at <u>9.30am next Wednesday</u> and we break for the Easter holiday at 1.30pm that day.


