Year 2 Parents Meeting

All Year 2 parents are invited to attend a SATs information talk on Thursday 2nd March 2017. Miss Kennedy and Mrs Mullaney will be explaining the process of the Year 2 SATs and sharing ways that you can support your child at home. The talk will start at 7:30pm in the hall. We look forward to seeing you there.

Reception

In Reception this week we have been learning how to speak in role using props to act out the story of 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' and also writing speech bubbles. In Maths we have focussed on our numbers and 2D shapes and have also learned about healthy lifestyles and eating habits. In Art we have used various types of media to create river scenes.

Year 1

We introduced the children to a new book this week 'Here come the aliens!' and have used this to focus on describing aliens using adjectives and writing compound sentences. In Maths we have been dividing into two and four groups, writing simple number sentences and have solved division problems using the skills we learned. We had fun in Science making papier mache 3D planets and learned how to make an observational drawing of a plant.





Year 2

In Maths this week we have been learning about place value, how to count forwards and backwards in multiples, and different methods of partitioning. In our topic work this week we have located Mexico on the map and in relation to our Chocolate theme have identified where we can find cocoa trees. In Science we have learned about the effects of salt on ice and made our own ice-cream in class!

Year 3

In Year 3 this week we started recorder lessons and some children are continuing with their cello lessons with Berkshire Maestros. We had a very musical morning on Wednesday! We have been learning about time, revisiting how to read analogue and digital clocks and also learned about Skara Brae, a stone-built Neolithic settlement on the west coast of Mainland Scotland and the importance this had on our understanding of prehistoric times.
