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

Dear Parents and Carers,

It was wonderful travelling to school in glorious spring weather yesterday. Isn't it uplifting to see all the daffodils and crocuses out in the park.

Reception

We've had so much fun this week using Mash Cam to insert our photos so that we look like astronauts. We then wrote about what we'd take into space. We've also been solving some mystery shape problems using mathematical language to describe and work out which 2D and 3D shapes were in the bag. We loved working with our friends, designing and making Junk Model Rockets.









Year 1

We are making great progress with fractions and our understanding of transformations. Do ask us to show you what a $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ and full turn is. We've planted seeds and have made predictions about what will happen and we can't wait for National Science Week next week. Look at the 'balloon' planets we've made in DT and our daffodil drawings. Aren't they fab?!







Year 2

As we mentioned in the Parent Planner at the beginning of the week, we have gone Aztec mad. We've started to plan and write information leaflets and design Aztec headdresses. In Maths we've been concentrating on position and direction, moving different objects in quarter turns.

Year 3

We've really enjoyed learning about Stonehenge and the mystery surrounding why it was built and how it was used. We've used clay to make our own designs similar to the ones the Beaker People put onto their pots. We've written the shape poems we planned last week and will share them with everyone on our class page on the website.
