## Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you enjoyed some safe bonfire night celebrations last weekend. We were talking in our assembly last Friday, about how some animals (and people) can find the noise and lights quite distressing and overwhelming and that dogs can be calmed by Reggae music being played in the house. If you tried this and it worked, please do let me know.

#### Reception

This week we've been revising all of the phonemes we've learnt so far and practised the Tricky Words (no, go, I, the, and, to). In Maths we've been learning to identify Numicon shapes up to 10 and after learning about Children in Need, we decorated Pudsey's eye patch with stickers. We're really enjoying learning some Spanish with Mrs Toro and have been focusing on aiming, throwing and catching in PE.

## Year 1

In Science this week, we've been revisiting the differences between garden and wild plants, as well as recapping the parts of a plant. We then had great fun planting garlic and are looking forward to observing how it grows over the next few months. Our plant dyes were ready to use this week and we experimented with them by soaking our socks in a dye bath before hanging them out to dry. We've also started to write our nonchronological reports about Rosa Parks.

#### Year 2

We have really enjoyed writing paragraphs for our leaflet about Castles and have started to add different photos and diagrams to them. As part of our focus on the story, The Paperback Princess, we've been investigating the properties of Everyday materials and trying to use the correct terminology to describe them. In IT, we've been using the Chrome books to help us learn how to access and create Google documents and we've started to learn some Netball skills in PE.

#### Year 3

This week in English, we have begun writing our explanation text on mummification, structuring it using subheadings and paragraphs. We've enjoyed learning about sources of evidence in History and have been exploring what a death mask can tell us about Egyptian culture, ahead of making our own. In Science we have been looking at what makes a healthy diet for Humans, what different food types there are and why these are beneficial for us to eat and in Maths we've been finding fractions of numbers, including thirds and fifths.

#### Year 4

It has been a really powerful week for us. We've been learning about the dangers of deforestation and used the information we learned, to draft a letter to our local MP, Matt Roddar, urging him to act on this important matter. In Science we've enjoyed learning more about how humans digest food and the steps involved in the digestive system and in Music we're learning the song Mamma Mia by ABBA. We're working on some Gymnastic moves and routines that we hope to perform to you before the end of this term and Mrs E says she'll pass on the dates for this early next week.

## Year 5

This week we've continued to read our class book, 'Viking Boy' and have been focusing on the skill of retrieval. In our writing, we've been developing our knowledge of expanded noun phrases and applying these to a piece of writing about Viking Mythology. We've enjoyed learning about separating solutions in Science and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and mixed numbers to improper fractions in Maths.

# Year 6

We have been looking into informal letters in more detail this week, writing from the perspective of soldiers and their loved ones fighting in the First World War. We've been making use of deep, empathetic language to portray the emotions that would have been paramount to these letters to and from home and been studying the tactics and inventions of WW1 and how they changed the state of warfare for subsequent wars. We've also focused on the armistice and our remembrance of those who have given their lives both in the First World War and other conflicts.

In Art, we have been looking at botanical art and poppies in particular and in Computing, we've been continuing to develop our knowledge of online safety and digital citizenship.

In Maths we've been exploring percentages and how to use them interchangeably with fractions and decimals. We'll then learn how to calculate percentages of a given quantity.

The sessions were really productive and we are confident that we will be able to make some positive and effective changes to some of the ways that we communicate and engage with you moving forwards.
