Reception

This week we've been using all our phonics knowledge to help us write the story of the Gingerbread man. We are really proud of our writing and can't wait for our parents to see it. We have really enjoyed making special bauble presents, completing Christmas Maths challenges, playing with sparkle, messy jelly and Christmas slime and loved taking part in our Christmas performance this morning.

Year 1

We were so pleased when Mrs Edwards came to see us first thing on Monday morning and said how impressed she was with the letters we wrote to her. She said we had been really persuasive and agreed that we could do some yarn bombing on one of the fences. Look at our efforts. Doesn't it look lovely! This inspired us to write more letters - but to Father Christmas this time.

We've also completed some Maths assessments and were hoping to plant out our garlic plants, to watch them grow in the Spring term, but it's been a little too cold this week. We hope to do this at the beginning of next week instead. We made Christingles in our RE and DT lessons and were so pleased to see so many of our parents at our Christmas performance.

Year 2

As well as completing different end of term assessments, we've been making puppets, using embroidery to create Christmas decorations and made Christmas cards. We've also made wooden star hanging decorations using lollipop sticks. It really has been a fun and creative week!

Year 3

We took part in parliament week, this week and really enjoyed learning about how to plan and debate our own motion. We have developed our understanding of the terms 'for' and 'against' and where laws are debated in this country. In Maths we've continued to learn about different types of lines, using the correct mathematical vocabulary for them and in Science, we've been designing our own vertebrate species. We had to think about whether our animal is a carnivore, omnivore or herbivore and how this would influence the body parts we would give it (e'g sharp teeth and claws).





Year 4

This week, we've been revising a variety of punctuation and grammar rules and practising them using a range of activities. We've completed different assessments in Maths and Science and learnt about the different foods eaten by the Maya people in the Rainforest. We are really proud of the death masks we've made and have been evaluating them and considering how closely we followed our design.

Year 5

We have been completing different progress assessments across core subjects this week and have also been planning for the edible treats we'll be making with our group this coming Monday. We are so excited about making them and will be getting all our ingredients and equipment ready over the weekend. Thank you for coming to our Christmas performance. We heard that you really loved our rendition of 'The Twelve Days of Christmas'. We have taken inspiration from 'The Nutcracker' for our Christmas cards this year, below is a selection.

We have really enjoyed watching everyone's homework presentations on WW1 and discussing what we've all learned from our study of this topic. We've also created a piece of writing that explores the use of description, action and dialogue and the interpretation of two characters. We've continued our unit on Geometry in Maths and on the changes of the body during puberty in PSHE.
