Enjoy reading the highlights of what the children at The Heights have been up to this week....

Reception

The children in Reception have begun learning Level 2 phonics with this week's focus on 's, a, t, p'. We have talked about words that begin with these sounds and also learnt actions to help us remember the sound that each letter makes. We have continued our focus on 'My family' and also talked about 'When I grow up..' and what it means to be an adult. The children spent some time with their teacher talking about what they wish to be when they are grown up. In Mathematics we explored numbers 1 and 2 and how they may be presented; by symbol, in words, Numicon and fingers. We have also explored the idea of matching two items that are the same. Next week we will begin our indoor games and yoga sessions on

Wednesday (2.10.24). Please ensure children are dressed in PE clothes with appropriate trainers.

Home Learning: See if you can help match all your socks together, making sure each creates a pair.

Year 1

This week in Year One's Maths lessons, we compared objects by matching, calculating one more and one less and using pictures of a crocodile's mouth to explain greater than, less than and equal to. We have learned the formation of the letter 'u' in pre-cursive hand-writing and the sound 'oy' in phonics (as in 'boy', 'annoy' and 'royal'). In English 'but' was used as a conjunction in our sentences about the Large family, we sequenced the steps of the story and drew a story map which we learned with actions. During our Science lesson we investigated the strength of the wind outside by observing the speed and movement of bubbles in the air. Our Art this week was based on sketching in the style of our focus artist Van Gogh, the children created amazing sketches of sunflowers in their new art books!









Year 2

Year 2 has had a busy and exciting week! Our trip to <u>Warwick Castle</u> was the highlight of the week. The children were immersed into the world of Zog where they had great fun training as knights and completing Zog's quest. We had the opportunity to look round the castle and learnt about some of its features and thoroughly enjoyed watching a fantastic falconry display where the birds swooped right above us! We then followed this up with a detailed and exciting recount of our day. Meanwhile, in Maths we have continued to develop our understanding of place value to compare and order numbers.









Year 3

In Year 3 this week, we have enjoyed doing lots of drama and role play in our lessons! In History, we made our own farming tools and then role played being an Ancient Egyptian farmer outside. In English we are exploring the thoughts and feelings of the character 'Sennapod' in our class book 'There's a Pharaoh in our Bath'. We used drama and freeze frames to think about the different feelings he might have and various points in the first chapter. We then used this to start writing a diary entry from Sennapod's point of view. In Science, we have been investigating friction by timing how long spinning tops spin on different types of surface.










Year 4 Sadly due to staff absence today, we are not able to share Year 4's highlights.

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have turned their attention to writing a newspaper article on Beowulf's victory over the monstrous Grendel. At the start of the week, they read different articles to identify the features to include in their own articles. In Maths, the children have continued to develop their understanding of place value, particularly how to round to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000 and 10,000. In History, Year 5 continued to learn more about Anglo-Saxon life by exploring who would live in a village and what their role was including carpenters, blacksmiths and the Thane. The children enjoyed a reflective Monday afternoon by learning about how different religions worship through music and prayer.







Year 6

Year 6 have undertaken the first set of practice SATs about which they showed impressive attitude and resilience. Meanwhile, in Science the children have focused on evolution, specifically Charles Darwin's contribution to the theory of evolution. Watching the children in their guitar lessons, it is clear that they have remembered all that they learned during their ukulele lessons in Year 3! Likewise, in PE the children are developing a great understanding of the formations and game-reading of Tag Rugby which they have developed across the year groups. It's great to watch.

Parking plea from a local neighbour

Reception reading books

Today your child will have brought home their sound book and will hopefully be able to share with you three of the sounds they have learnt this week. We hope you will be able to practice these sounds on a regular basis as repetition goes a long way to embedding the learning. Next week we will be sending home the children's first reading books, which will be in the form of a picture book. It would be lovely if you can sit with your child and discuss the story together throughout the week. We will give more advice on how to use the sound books and reading books when we see you on **Wednesday 9th October at the Parent Information Evening.** This will take place at 6pm in the school hall where the PTFA will be providing refreshments and Harrisons Catering will be providing a taste of the meals they deliver at school.
